In addition to the development of a light rail transit network within the city of Ottawa, wheels are in motion to bring commuters into the city by rail.

With interest in commuter rail surfacing from all corners of the region, groups from the Pontiac and Renfrew Counties are among the most proactive. The SADC (Société d'aide au développement de la collectivité) has been leading the initiative.

"The time is right and there is a need," says SADC executive director Louise Donaldson, "but there is a tremendous amount of work to be done before the first commuter train can ever leave the station."

With the cooperation of Ottawa Central Railway, the SADC and municipalities the Pontiac and Renfrew County are interested in getting a sense of rail service on the line.

The October 5th pilot train is not necessarily indicative of the kind of equipment envisioned – it's more an opportunity for area policy makers, elected officials and media to enjoy a day on the train in a casual environment; a chance to talk commuter rail service and to share a dream in a casual setting.
